To continue with our core principles of early age training and basic skills enhancement, this month we will be concentrating on building five acute senses. Throughout his/her life, your child will take in new information through their senses. From their very first days, children develops the parts of their brain that deal with vision, smell, and hearing. Then, as they develop other brain pathways in sequence, they learn to talk, sing, draw, read, write, think and create.

For the first eight years of life, and especially the first four, a child has a truly absorbent mind. He simply soaks up experiences. Take advantage of this by providing as many sensory experiences as possible.

Healthy body, healthy mind – Different parts of the brain control different parts of the body. The more movement and touching experience a youngster gets in the first few years of life, the more thorough the base for all-round education later.

In our everyday physical activities we will be doing spinning, jumping, balancing, climbing and rolling. These activities make the ear-fluid move rapidly inside the ear mechanism, and this helps grow new, active cells in the part of the brain that develops the sense of balance and the “muscle-memory” needed for reading and writing.

Some stimulating toys that we will be using this month are -

- Wooden blocks in squares, oblongs, triangles, half-circles, diagonals, curves, and pillars that they can build with.
- Simple musical instruments, such as a small xylophone, bells, tambourine, triangle, drum.
- A magnifying glass and a torch.
- A peg board, over which you can stretch elastic bands to make simple geometric shapes.
- Take-apart trucks and toys.
- A playhouse.
- A box full of disposable packaging, yogurt cartons, cardboard cartons, plastic containers, plastic jars, toilet roll tubes, string.
- A giant magnet to experiment with.
- Child-sized kitchen.
