## *Note:*

Since weather is turning pleasant, the children will be playing outside for some time during the day. Please ensure they bring hats, caps, and sun blocks.

Under the principles of early age training and basic skills enhancement, this month we will be concentrating on rich vocabulary. Words let us think, create ideas and reason. A poor vocabulary leads to a poor level of reasoning. A rich vocabulary, in contrast, leads to higher levels of reasoning and creativity, and skill in communication-skills that are highly valued in later life. It all starts with a love of words.

## **Talk, talk, and talk to him/her!**

To learn to speak the basics of a language before starting school is a fantastic achievement. It is achieved largely through meaningful interaction between you and your child. Tell him what is happening when it is happening. The brain stores information in group of ideas. So when you see a new subject- a dog or a flower- try to build on your child's existing knowledge by talking about what you see. The more you link ideas together, the more he will learn.

Considering the above topic we will be reading stories everyday suitable for their age. We will be playing colour games like take turns seeing who's first to spot something, for example, blue. We will start with primary colours: red, yellow, green and blue. We will ask the child to touch as many blue things (or soft, hard, or wooden things) as possible. How many yellow foods can he think of? How many things in the house are white. Describe colours in words that conjure up other senses – chocolate, lime, citrus, lavender, and peach. Colour knowledge helps visual discrimination as well as vocabulary (there are tens of thousands of colour shades). We will be playing 'Simon Says'. When you preface an action by saying, "Simon Says" he must copy you. The children not only pay attention, but also stretch their imagination when you say things like, "Simon Says: 'Be excited', 'Be sad', 'Be happy'."

We will be discussing other people's jobs – like doctor, policeman, fireman, librarian, bank clerk, and teacher. This builds vocabulary, and demonstrates how our society is built on cooperation.

Among the 3 year old children namely – Rashida, Alvin, Joy, Safia and Jasmine, the top performer is **Rashida**.
